Hailed for her "power, suppleness, and expressive depth," soprano Mary Sullivan has appeared as a soloist with numerous ensembles in New England. She has appeared as a recitalist at Bowdoin College's Studzinski Recital Hall with pianist and Artist in Residence George Lopez, and has been a featured soloist for Opera Maine. Recent repertoire highlights include the Strauss Vier letzte Lieder; the Mozart Requiem; Handel's Messiah; the Pergolesi Stabat Mater;

Mendelssohn's *Elijah*; and the Haydn "Creation Mass." She recently performed the role of Violetta in the Colby College Symphony Orchestra's presentation of scenes from Verdi's *La Traviata*.

A gifted teacher and vocal coach, Ms. Sullivan is the co-founder of Amethyst Chamber Ensemble, an instrumental and vocal chamber ensemble, offering salon, recital, and full concert programs throughout the season. Ms. Sullivan maintains a private voice studio in Brunswick, Maine.

"Sullivan gave intensely dramatic readings, with ample measures of ecstasy in the Holmès, and anger, terror, and resignation in the Larsen' (Allan Kozinn, Portland Press Herald, April 2016).



Andrea Graichen, mezzo-soprano, is a frequent soloist in the Greater Portland area, performing a wide variety of alto and mezzo-soprano repertoire. She is a longtime member of ChoralART. Andrea sang with the St. Mary Schola early music ensemble for ten years. She was also a founding member of Portland's Dirigo Ensemble.

Andrea has appeared as a guest artist with the

Portland Symphony Orchestra (PSO). She sang the role of Mother Jeanne in the PSO's presentation of Poulenc's opera *Dialogues of the Carmelites*. Andrea's most recent recital appearance featured French art song, works from Broadway, and an extensive variety of American art song. Solo repertoire includes Mozart's *Parto! Ma tu ben mio (La Clemenza di Tito)*, Schubert's *Der Hirt auf dem Felsen*, Robert S. Cohen's *Alzheimer's Stories*, Pergolesi's *Stabat Mater*; Poulenc's *Gloria*; Stravinsky's *Mass*; Mendelssohn's *Elijah*, Britten's *Ceremony of Carols*; Bach's *Mass in B minor*; Handel's *Messiah*; Mozart's *Coronation Mass*, *Regina Coeli*, and *Requiem*; plus many smaller works, among them Strozzi's *Lagrime Mie*, Ballio's *The Old Bridge at Florence*, Monteverdi's *Lamento d'Ariana*, and the tone-deaf diva comedy piece, *A Word on My Ear* by Flanders and Swann.



Jamie Knobloch, alto, has been singing just for the joy of it all her life. Singing with family, school and church choirs developed that passion in her early life. Later, she added community choruses wherever she lived, including the Colby Camerata, the Occasional Chorale and the Colby Kennebec Choral Society as well as the Sheepscot Valley Chorus.

For 22 years, Jamie directed an office choir at Thorndike Press in Waterville, where she was Publisher, to perform at company holiday parties and to bring cheer to local nursing homes and assisted living facilities. She established the bell choir at the Congregational Church of Boothbay Harbor in 2014 and is currently its director.



Michael Gonzales, tenor, has been praised as having a "sweet and resonant" tenor voice as well as "sonically stunning." And is quickly making himself known in the performing arts world. He has performed a variety of roles ranging from Colonel Fairfax - Yeomen of the Guard, Gilbert and Sullivan to Satyavan - Savitri, G. Holst along with international performances most recently with the American Institute of Musical Studies in Graz, Austria.

Artistic Director Linda Blanchard earned her MA in Choral Conducting from University of Michigan School of Music, Ann Arbor. She is recipient of the Susan Winchell Burnett Music Prize, the Abraham Goldberg Prize and the St. Botolph Emerging Artist Award. She studied orchestral conducting with Gustav Meier and choral conducting with Theodore Morrison, Jerry Blackstone, and Robert Greenlee. Ms. Blanchard is founding director of St. Cecilia Chamber Choir, directs the Sheepscot Valley

Chorus and Lincoln Arts Festival Chorus, and is Director of Choirs at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, Newcastle. She has worked as a festival adjudicator, directed the Bowdoin College Chamber Choir, University of Michigan Orpheus Singers, worked in Maine and Michigan as a church organist and choir director, taught junior high and high school chorus in Maine, taught voice at Bowdoin College, and worked extensively as a musical theater director.

Assistant Artistic Director Sean Fleming is a performer and arranger who performs regularly with Bowdoin Chorus, Down East Singers, Lincoln Academy Lincolnaires, Lincoln Festival Chorus, Maine Friends of Music, Midcoast Community Chorus, St. Cecilia Chamber Choir, Sheepscot Valley Chorus, and Tapestry Singers. He serves as the music director of the Hearts Ever Young Chorus in Damariscotta. He has collaborated with Ann Arbor Camerata, Bowdoin Chamber Choir, Bowdoin Summer Music Festival Chorus, Coastal Chorale, Colby College Chorale, Maine Pro Musica, Oratorio Chorale, Portland Early Music Festival, Renaissance Voices, University of Michigan Gilbert and Sullivan Society, University of Southern Maine Chorale, University of Southern Maine Chamber Singers, and Vox Nova Chamber Choir. He has music directed and accompanied over seventy-five musicals, with organizations such Camden Civic Theater, Heartwood Regional Theater Company, Lincoln Theater, Lyric Music Theater, State Theater of Ann Arbor, University of Michigan Gilbert and Sullivan Society, Waldo Theater, and Watts Hall Community Players. Sean studied organ and piano with Ray Cornils, John Doney, Michael Lindsey, and Gerald McGee. For the past twenty-seven years he has served as the organist at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church in Newcastle. He is recipient of a 2009 St. Botolph Club Foundation Emerging Artist Award.

Having received both a bachelor's and a Masters in Vocal Performance from the New England Conservatory, Michael maintains an active partnership with several organizations including the Boston Cathedral singers who recently released an Album, From the bell tower. Other active partnerships include Piccola Opera, Cambridge Chamber Ensemble, Amethyst Ensemble and Hartford Opera Theater.



John David Adams, bass-baritone, is an accomplished artist with a professional career spanning concert, opera, recital, and vocal ensembles. Praised for the "depth and power" of his singing and "consistently polished and graceful" performances, his concert repertoire ranges from Baroque masterworks to world-premiere compositions including engagements with the San Francisco Symphony, Berkeley Symphony, Berkeley Lyric Opera Orchestra, San

Francisco Bach Choir, Hartford Symphony, Bangor Symphony, North Shore Philharmonic, Arlington Philharmonic, Midcoast Symphony, Maine Pro Musica, St. Mary Schola, Masterworks Chorale, Oratorio Chorale, Nashua Choral Society, Longfellow Chorus, Colby Symphony and Chorus, Bowdoin Chorus, as well as being a returning artist for the Lincoln Arts, Blue Hill Bach, White Mountain Bach, and Portland Early Music festivals. He is also a member of the New England-based Zenith Ensemble and Maine's Amethyst Chamber Ensemble. He has been equally praised for diverse opera and musical stage roles, from Handel (Acis and Galatea) to Sondheim (Sweeney Todd, A Little Night Music), including productions with Opera Boston, San Francisco Lyric Opera, San Francisco Summer Opera, Berkeley Opera, Granite State Opera, Opera Maine (formerly PORTopera), Apollo Opera, Maine State Music Theater, and New England Light Opera. He studied voice and opera at Hartt School of Music and the San Francisco Conservatory of Music, and currently serves on the voice faculty at Bay Chamber Concerts Music School in addition to his private voice studio.
